5 Year Action Plan

Ongoing activities

E.C.T.E.G will provide ongoing support to organisations delivering courses developed under the AGIS and ISEC projects, by making the training material available through Europol, in its most current form and providing training support where possible.

The Group will promote the availability of the training programme to Law Enforcement by whatever methods are appropriate, including but not limited to using existing channels of communication such as Interpol, Europol, Cepol, UNODC, Council of Europe, Eurojust and the European Commission as well as industry and academic partners.

2010

1. Manage sub groups to conduct specific tasks and produce progress reports to the E.C.T.E.G plenary. All E.C.T.E.G sub groups will be project defined and will have a determinate length of time to produce their work. Some projects may be continuing but will be required to report progress and have their objectives reviewed by the Group on an annual basis at the first meeting of each year. The following groups will or have been formed:

- a. **Courses Sub Group**
 - i. **Courses**
 - ii. **New Courses Development**
- b. **Academic Sub Group**
- c. **Communication and Recruitment**

2. Apply to the European Commission for funding under the ISEC programme to develop 3 further training courses.
3. Apply to the European Commission for funding under the ISEC programme to further develop the 2CENTRE project introducing 2 further national centres into the network
4. Apply to the European Commission to update a selection of the currently available training courses.
5. Accept Interpol's offer to fund the upgrade and restructure of the existing introductory course on forensic computing and network investigations

2011 Work Plan

1. Apply to the European Commission for funding under the ISEC programme to develop 3 further training courses.
2. Apply to the European Commission for funding under the ISEC programme to further develop the 2CENTRE project introducing 2 further national centres into the network.
3. Update 8 Intermediate EC funded training courses.

2012 Work Plan

1. Explore the possibility to apply for funding to re run the ISEC programme MSc again directly after the 2008 – 2011 programme including additional modules if required.
2. Apply to the European Commission for funding under the ISEC programme to develop 3 further training courses.
3. Update 5 Intermediate EC funded training courses.
